Prohibited actions:	<ul> <li>AP mine use</li> <li>AP mine production</li> <li>AP mine retention</li> <li>AP mine transfers</li> <li>Assistance others in any prohibited act</li> </ul>
Required actions:	<ul> <li>Destruction of stockpiles</li> <li>Clearance of mined areas</li> <li>Assistance to victims</li> <li>Annual transparency report</li> <li>Measures to prevent / suppress prohibited acts</li> </ul>
